Postmaster-Elect's Wife Dies in City Early Friday A.M.

Mrs. Della Morgareidge, wife of Johnson W. Morgareidge, superintendent of the Sheridan County Memorial Hospital, who soon will become postmaster, succeeding Sherman D. Canfield, died at 2:15 o'clock Friday morning at the hospital where last Monday she underwent a major operation. Mrs. Morgareidge had been in ill health for several months.

Mrs. Morgareidge was born July 18, 1875 at Maryville, Mo. She came to Sheridan with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Reuben Collier, in 1882 and had been a resident of this city almost continuously since that time. Mrs. Morgareidge was a member of the first class to graduate from Sheridan county high school.

She is survived by her husband, Johnson W. Morgareidge; one daughter, Miss Ruth Morgareidge; one sister, Mrs. Mable Clifford, who resides in Sheridan; and a brother, Oscar Collier of Lubbock, Tex.

She was an active and valued member of the First Baptist church, a past matron of Naomi Chapter No. 2, Order of the Eastern Star, and a member of the Diamond Rebekah Lodge No. 8. During her life time she was always active in church, civic and social affairs.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon at the First Baptist church, the Rev. James P. Blackledge officiating. Interment will be made at Mount Hope Cemetery.
